



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Can of Worms

ean Hubert Celerine, also known as Franklin, could not have imagined that his decision, illadvised for all intents and purposes, to go public in a bid to run down social activist-politician Bruneau Laurette would open up such a can of worms that has caused more harm to himself - and it now seems to some high-profile individuals as well - than what he bargained for. The worms that have come to the surface to date have shed light on the extent of drug importation, proliferation and trafficking in the country, especially along the western coast, together with its attendant money-laundering activities as revealed by the current ICAC investigations. They have also brought to the fore the alleged "mafia infiltration" of key public institutions as stated by the "best informed person of the country", the Prime Minister himself.

The latest furore that has come to light relates to corruption money to the tune of Rs3.5 million having been traded for the renewal of a Shooting and Fishing and Eco-Tourism Lease to the benefit of Eco Deer Park Association for some 250 hectares of forest land in the immediate vicinity of Ganga Talao, commonly known as Grand Bassin. This latest revelation comes in the wake of veiled attacks levelled by Bruneau Laurette about rave parties organised on ranch premises built on the leased lands with the alleged participation of people close to power. More details have come out about the presence of one Senior Minister, a Parliamentary Private Secretary, a high-level civil servant, one or more female gentry and other middle-men at a secret feast held on 12 September 2020, and who would be allegedly involved in the money transaction relating the renewal of the lease.

The presumption of innocence and the right to a fair trial are basics that anybody in a democracy is entitled to, and caution has to be exercised until guilt is established on the basis of solid evidence pertaining to the transaction that culminated in the lease renewal. It would seem that none has been furnished to date, and it would be up to the competent authorities to establish the guilt or innocence of those targeted by whistle blowers and other parties. There is no doubt that we do have the legal and institutional framework to go to the bottom of the case, and the institutions have the authority to seize mobiles and request phone and bank records of all parties involved as would be expected of them. Delays would only heighten suspicions and doubts that palatable narratives may be on the kitchen stove to save some skins. This is

where there is a hitch as regards the intent of those institutions to deliver results in the wider public interest, despite our country being under the scanner of the EU and now the US State Department. We are not aware if there are unexplainable complexities and factors that are acting as a cloud over the operations of such investigative agencies, but it bears repeating that ICAC's track record on this score leaves much to be desired - starting with its inexplicable turnaround in the MedPoint case, and extending to numerous affairs where it is yet to be known where its inquiries stand, such as the Dufry scandal (2015); the Alvaro Sobrinho scandal (2018); the Yerrigadoo/Bet 365 scandal (2018); the Glen Agliotti affair (2019), and finally the Serenity Gate/Film Rebate Scheme scandal (2019). We need not document the perversion of Public Procurement procedures in major purchasing ministries or even the CEB's St Louis Redevelopment Project flagged by the African Development Bank. All these pending inquiries highlight the absence of a credible and respected investigative agency capable of handling white collar crime independently of political proximity.

As regards the political fallout of this case, much will depend on how the Prime Minister will handle what looks like yet another scandal with the potential to cast a huge cloud over his government's integrity and accountability credentials. Ivan Collendavelloo, who earlier had received the PM's marching orders in the wake of the CEB's St Louis Redevelopment Project scandal must be watching with some glee the unfolding drama within the rank of the government he still forms part of despite his demotion from Deputy PM to simple MP -- much before the ICAC could complete its investigation into the St Louis affair. Its report anyway is yet to be made public.

Meantime, in his Sunday Easter speech that has gone viral, Cardinal Piat has been unusually forthcoming in his criticisms of a government, more cruelly so with regard to the drug proliferation business, a moral theme that may have garnered far wider support than just within his folk. It is symptomatic of the strength of that moral plea that the current DPM was apparently despatched to meet the Cardinal at the Eveche and the PM has agreed to meet representatives of the Catholic church on Wednesday last.

Whether this will bring some change or more of the same, the country can only watch and pray that easy money and greed have not become the sole engines of our development.

Beneath the Trump circus, American democracy faces up to a vital challenge

As the former president faces court, this will be yet another litmus test for the strength of American democracy. And it's an essential one

ormer US President Donald J Trump has been charged with 34 felony counts in New York. In the words of Manhattan district attorney Alvin Bragg, Trump is accused of making "34 false statements", themselves "made to cover up other crimes". Those crimes include a "conspiracy to promote a candidacy by unlawful means" and to "scheme with others to influence the 2016 presidential election".

The charges in New York add to the network of cases focused on Trump's efforts to subvert and undermine democratic processes in the United States, now stretching all the way back to his 2016 candidacy and across the duration of his presidential administration.

The charges shouldn't really come as a surprise. As recently as December 2022, Trump called for the "termination" of the Constitution so that he could return to power. The former president has always been brazen in his contempt for the rule of law.

But it is genuinely, historically significant that a former president is facing criminal charges and trial. This is an enormous shift in the norms and standards that have governed American politics for decades.

Trump's arraignment proceeded as expected: he arrived at court, was processed, and pleaded not guilty to those 34 charges. Amid a media frenzy, he left court and flew home to safer ground in Florida. At Mar-a-Lago, he made a standard stump speech listing his grievances and dramatically mischaracterising the investigations into his conduct.

As Trump's indictment and arraignment have played out, he and his supporters have employed now distressingly familiar techniques for inciting their followers. Last week, Trump threatened "death and destruction", posting a picture of himself wielding a baseball bat next to a picture of the Manhattan district attorney's head.

Monkey Business at Grand Bassin

here is a growing perception that the ICAC, since the coming into office of the MSM ruling dispensations, has not been renowned for conducting with a minimum of zeal and professionalism enquiries in any case that might have involved those close to higher offices in government circles. The only exception that we have been given to see lately concerns its money-laundering investigations into the Franklin affair. The list is otherwise long enough in several high-profile cases that have erupted since 2015. The St Louis CEB procurement saga is still dawdling along at ICAC after 7-8 years despite a Senior Minister having been made to step down by the Prime Minister and several exchanges with either the Scandinavian company BWSC or the African Development Bank as funding agency. More affairs erupted since then, namely, over the corrupt procurement processes at Health, Commerce and the State Trading Corporation during the pandemic concerning health supplies, equipment, vaccines and pharmaceuticals, where again the Minister of Commerce and Consumer Protection was forced to vacate his post but without any substantial progress on any of the several enquiries that would have been largely justified.

Other Ministers when replying to awkward allegations, resorted to stating that the matter had been referred to ICAC for

enquiries: e.g., the acting Minister of Commerce and Consumer Protection in the case of Rs 500 M of illegal cigarette paper imported in the island or the Minister of Health on the saga of Molnupiravir pills, millions of which were purchased once at Rs 9 and the very next day at Rs 79 without, it seems, fully abiding by procurement processes. In those and perhaps other cases the mantle of an ICAC enquiry was perceived to be a

poli-tical convenience where embarrassing questions could no longer be asked.

It was therefore somewhat of a surprise that, while Franklin had been on the ADSU radar since 2016 and the Reunion authorities had condemned the guy for drug trafficking in absentia to 7 years jail time, ICAC felt empowered around February to launch with unusual vigour its money-laundering investigations into

drug warlord Franklin's operations on the West Coast, with all its tentacular ramifications. Where will this ICAC enquiry lead to, ask the sceptics, who wonder how much leeway, protection and for how long Franklin was allowed to augment his business and fly in and out of the country unhindered? The collateral revelations that a Senior Minister, a PPS and select guests were allegedly revelling in a Black Label stag party a few hundred metres from Grand Bassin while settling an alleged corrupt deal of Rs 3.5m for 700 acres of land lease sometime in 2020 came as an unexpected thunderbolt. Donald Trump charged with 34 felony counts

ast Friday, former President Donald J. Trump, faced the first of a tough series of legal affairs, criminal and civil, as a Manhattan Grand Jury decided that the prosecutory evidence presented by District Attorney Alvin Bragg was sufficiently convincing to merit an indictment and trial before the appropriate court. Both the District Attorney and the 45th President will go down in US history, the first for securing a historic indictment against a guy who was known for using every legal artifice, including confidential settlement where inevitable, to avoid facing arrest and indictment and the second as the only former President in US history to face indictment and arrest on such criminal charges as would be disclosed this past Tuesday.

While the Republican Party was up in arms, expressing outrage or condemning an alleged subversion of the judiciary for political ends, and others may sympathise somewhat with a guy who lived a wealthy lifestyle which did not require his entrance into politics, for many others, Trump is regally despised as the symbol of the culture and identity wars as represented by the rearguard Make America Great Again (MAGA) wing, embracing undertones of racist and anti-Jewish feelings, while he and the Republicans focused on

large tax cuts for the wealthiest.

Political discourse has shifted undeniably from civilised oppositions and debates to diatribes so versed in mutual hate and contempt that the more educated elites, often attacked by Trump as the fake news or deep state establishment, face difficult times making any sensible arguments heard. The atmosphere has become almost toxic for Latinos, blacks, browns and Asians as certain channels like Fox News and fringe MAGA media outlets have given space and sound to the furious and grievously frustrated White Anglo Saxon Protestants (WASPs) who feel and act increasingly like a threatened minority.

The current indictment is admittedly a rather weak and sordid affair based on hush money payments to a female porn star and stripper Stormy Daniels through his attorney-

fixer and it has nonetheless led the latter to disbarment and a three-year jail term. It remains to be seen whether the ex-President, using every delaying legal tactic his lawyers come up with, ultimately faces some consequence for his part in that scurrilous affair. That,

however, is only the beginning of Trump's legal woes as several District Attorneys, across different States, focus onto his role in such matters as the Jan-6 riots in Washington DC or the attempt to get more votes in Georgia at the last presidential elections.

In effet, l'alliance rouge-mauve-bleue en gestation a du mal à trouver la dynamique requise pour renverser le gouvernement actuellement. Nous verrons bien si la mayonnaise prend à un moment donné, comme cela avait été le cas avec le 'Vire Mam' de 2014, mais plusieurs analystes s'accordent à dire que les signes envoyés par l'opposition ne correspondent pas à ce qu'attendrait le peuple.

En mettant de l'avant les mêmes leaders et les mêmes figures, l'opposition indique clairement qu'elle ne comprend pas les enjeux du moment. Et cela pose un immense problème.

e fait majeur de cette semaine est la sortie très remarquée du Cardinal Piat contre le gouvernement lors de son homélie du dimanche des Rameaux. Monseigneur Piat a exprimé le sentiment que partagent beaucoup de Mauriciens quant à la séquence des évènements politiques depuis quelque temps déjà.

Monsieur Piat est un citoyen mauricien comme les autres, il a le droit de s'exprimer sur ce qu'il souhaite. Mais Monseigneur Piat n'est pas un simple citoyen, et cette prise de parole soulève de sérieuses questions. Pas tant sur le fond, puisqu'il est difficile de ne pas lui donner raison et qu'il a pris l'initiative à la place de l'opposition politique, des leaders d'opinion et des intellectuels.

Ces derniers n'ont jamais été muets quant aux affaires troublantes qui se succèdent et quant au glissement certain de nos institutions. Mais la parole du Cardinal porte un poids que les autres n'ont pas, ce qui témoigne d'autant plus du lien complexe entre religion et politique à Maurice. Le fond était donc clair et il n'y a rien à dire. Toutefois la forme était problématique puisqu'elle relève d'une prise de position politique qui pourrait constituer un précédent fâcheux puisqu'il ouvrirait potentiellement une boîte de pandore.

Est-ce le rôle des religieux de prendre position publiquement sur l'actualité politique? Est-ce qu'il en va du rôle des politiques et des gouvernants de réagir et de répondre à une parole d'un religieux? Quelles sont les limites à ne pas franchir dans ce contexte? Si un religieux prend position sur la politique, alors est-ce qu'un politique peut prendre position sur la religion et sa place dans la société?

Si Monseigneur Piat prend position sur la politique, alors pourquoi est-ce qu'un prêtre hindou, un Iman musulman ou un moine bouddhiste ne pourraient pas le faire, avec l'immense risque de sombrer dans une concurrence des interprétations théologiques sur le fait politique? Comment situer les limites dans ce cas?

Quand un chef religieux prend position sur une question éminemment politique, la distinction entre l'homme religieux et l'homme politique risque de se brouiller. Et le risque qu'un politicien réponde aux propos d'un religieux sur des termes politiques devient réel, brouillant la frontière entre deux sphères qui se doivent de rester complètement séparées.

En prenant position de la sorte, le Cardinal s'est exposé au risque qu'un membre du gouvernement réagisse de la même façon qu'il le ferait vis-à-vis d'un adversaire politique, ce qui pourrait ouvrir un débat qui deviendrait vite extrêmement tendu. Nous n'en sommes pas encore là, heureusement, mais c'est un terrain glissant et il faut faire très attention.

L'exception mauricienne

Ces frontières furent historiquement toujours respectées à Maurice. La Constitution les impose, même si la pratique laïque ne fait pas partie des mœurs locales. De ce point de vue, il est de tradition que les sphères religieuses et politiques se rencontrent et il est normalisé que ces deux sphères entretiennent une conversation sur l'état de notre pays. Il n'y a là rien de nouveau, et c'est aussi ce qui fait l'exception mauricienne en matière de gouvernance.

Mais cette pratique et cette tradition avaient toujours des limites qui n'étaient jamais franchies. Ou plutôt, si la limite était franchie, alors elle l'était par les prises de position des religieux et des politiques qui défendaient des agendas idéologiques frôlant la radicalisation qui veut qu'il n'y ait plus de distinction entre l'État et la religion.

Et c'est exactement sur ce point que l'homélie de Monseigneur Piat nous interpelle. La forme était-elle appropriée? Absolument rien ne l'empêchait d'exprimer ses craintes directement au Premier ministre, au Président de la République ou au gouvernement dans son ensemble, par le biais d'une lettre privée ou d'une conversation. Monseigneur Piat aurait également pu émettre un communiqué à l'issue d'une telle conversation. Mais tel ne fut pas le cas.

Le fondement de la démocratie et de la modernité est la séparation fondamentale entre la politique et la religion, entre la gouvernance et la théologie. What Legacy for the Future?

If the leaders should worry about one thing besides looking after their own interests, it is about what legacy they want to be remembered and maybe thanked for

ver the past couple of decades, a certain pattern seems to have set in on the political front: the rot that begins to eat into the ruling regime towards the end of a se-

cond mandate. This happened when Labour was nearing the completion of its second term, leading to the victory of the next MSM-led government in 2014 and the near-electoral wipe-out of Labour. Now the MSM is afflicted with the same ill, and there is a clamour among the public to do away with it and to bring back the previous dispensation. Based on their known histories and trajectories, local folklore describes this phenomenon as *blanc bonnet-bonnet blanc*.

In light of this perception, and to save the country from this burden with its repetitive adverse fallouts on the country and citizens, there is an obvious solution: reduce each electoral term to four years (that is, before the bug sets in), and limit the mandate of the party leader to only two terms. But of course, this will never happen, because it will need a constitutional amendment which the parties will be the first to oppose vigorously. They will prefer to lose and take in the public opprobrium, then wait out in the desert until they present themselves the next time round - rather than to retire and to act as mentors and guides with a succession plan and fresh team(s), for reasons best known to themselves. I concede, however, that, (a) this is easier said than done, and (b) I am not familiar with the internal nitty-gritty of political parties that may 'militate' against such eventuality.

Not everyone can be a Nelson Mandela: he decided to serve only one term, stepping down in glory when it was over. He received the love and respect of his people, in fact of the whole world for this second magnanimity – the first one being to forgive his apartheid oppressors and invite them to participate in building a new South Africa. That it hasn't quite come to be is another matter, and surely, he cannot bear the blame for that.

In the current atmosphere that begins to smell like the end of yet another political era, the pressures and speculations are similar – dismissal of minister/public officer, call for earlier general elections, more concrete action and outcomes in a number of pending cases, etc. But nothing could be more uncertain.

As a result, there is a widespread feeling of disgust bordering on despair that prevails in the country. One comes across groups of people passionately talking about it, as much as there are others too who prefer to be in denial so as not to spoil their mood or their day as it were.

But it is undeniable that there is anxiety and apprehension about not only the present state of affairs but about the future, and for most citizens it is about the future of the children and the young who are caught in this unhealthy web of machinations against which they are powerless.

looking after their own interests, it is about what legacy they want to be remembered and maybe thanked for, as regards the future of the country and the citizens, especially the upcoming generations who pin their hopes on what these leaders have in store for them. Theirs is undoubtedly a genuine concern.

How can they feel confident about their future when they learn that the country's institutions are infiltrated by the mafia(s), that there is a lack of trust in several institutions, that people in positions of responsibility are not assuming it to the full extent that they should because they give in to interference (in the process compromising their integrity), that there is an unprecedented constitutional crisis at the highest level because of a conflict between the police and the office of the DPP, that cases against drug traffickers who are caught drag on interminably, that other cases fall through because of loopholes in investigative procedures - and so on and so forth. Also, when they are confronted year-in year-out with the Annual Audit Report that reveals the enormity of wastage of taxpayer money that seems unresolvable.

Is it any wonder that those who proceed overseas for their studies do not hesitate to stay back if they get an opportunity? Alas, though, only a relatively few can have such openings, and both post Covid and with the war in Ukraine, countries of destination which are mainly Europe and North America are not as open as before. In fact, several big companies such as Facebook, Amazon, Google, Microsoft have been laying off workers by the tens of thousands in recent months, a trend that seems set to continue for an indeterminate period.

There is job contraction in other sectors as well. Thus, our citizens have therefore to fall back on the

country's capacity to provide for their future prospects and expectations of work, decent and affordable housing, education for their children, and amenities that they enjoy in a climate of security. The latter is not guaranteed when social ills such as drugs, control of which appears to be ever elusive, and crimes of all sorts compound an already stressed social situation that add to the woes and worries

As if these are not enough, citizens have to face being bombarded with details of sordid unfolding dramas in the public sphere on a daily basis. The average layman is left open-mouthed in disbelief accompanied by shock at not only the unpalatable practices that are gratuitously commented upon on social media but also

the sheer amounts of monies that are bandied about, ranging from tens and hundreds of millions to billions of rupees. And this when the cost of living keeps going up.

One must not imagine, though, that it is only those at the bottom of the heap who are left trailing. Even those who belong to the so-called middle class and who are assumed to be better off are also engaged in a qualitative struggle to make progress in their lives and to fulfill the legitimate expectations of their families in terms of decent housing and basic and post-basic education for their children.

For this to happen, one does not need salaries approaching millions per month, but they must be enough to allow one to provide for daily needs beyond mere subsistence levels, to make provision for the future (old age contingencies in particular) through secure savings schemes with solid regulatory oversight, and to ensure that children can be supported till they be-come autonomous. That is what a civilized society is all about, and that is what governments in such societies are expected by their citizens to work towards.

Both the public and the private sectors use the language of millions and billions with regard to plans and projects that are being proposed, and what the people would like to see is how these humongous sums of money will improve the quality of life in the country, overall as well as at the individual level. Especially where Private Public Partnerships are concerned, greater transparency is required so as to demonstrate clearly that the corporate-politics tacit nexus model is indeed benefiting the people, and genuinely taking them and the country forward towards a future of hope and optimism. What other way is there?

French President Emmanuel Macron meets Xi Jinping in Beijing

President Emmanuel Macron met his Chinese counterpart Xi Jinping in Beijing on Thursday, as the French leader seeks to dissuade China from supporting Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

Macron had said in a speech in the capital that Beijing can play a "major role" in finding a path to peace in the conflict and welcomed China's "willingness to commit to a resolution".

The French president, who arrived on Wednesday for a three-day state visit, shook hands with Xi outside the Great Hall of the People, the heart of power in the capital.

Xi greeted his guest on a huge red carpet lined by Chinese and French flags as the countries' national anthems played, reports AFP.

Western pressure is mounting on China to help push for peace in Ukraine. Though Beijing is officially neutral, Xi has never condemned the Russian invasion.

While he recently went to Moscow to reaffirm his alliance with Putin -- framed as an anti-Western front -- Xi has not even spoken on the phone with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky.

Macron, who is accompanied on his visit by European Commission chief Ursula von der Leyen, said he wants to "be a voice that unites Europe" over Ukraine, and that coming to China with her serves to "underline the consistency of this approach".

In a Thursday morning meeting with Chinese Premier Li Qiang at the Great Hall of the People, Macron stressed the importance of dialogue between China and France "in these troubled times".

Taiwan tensions

The visit comes in the face of mounting Chinese pressure on Taiwan, with the island's President Tsai Ing-wen meeting in California with US House Speaker Kevin McCarthy.

Macron told journalists Wednesday he did not think his Chinese counterparts had "a desire to overreact" to the meeting.

Tsai hailed the talks, saying they showed the selfruled island was "not isolated" on the international stage.

Beijing balks at any official contact between Taipei and the rest of the world, insisting there is only "one China".

China had repeatedly warned both sides the meeting should not take place and deployed an aircraft carrier through waters near Taiwan hours before the talks went ahead

Three additional warships were detected in waters separating the island from mainland China, Taiwan's Ministry of National Defence said on Thursday.

Saudi Arabia, Iran to reopen embassies, ease travel as part by deal brokered by China: Report

Tran's semiofficial news agency ISNA reported Thursday that Saudi Arabia and Iran agreed to reopen diplomatic missions in their respective capitals and in additional cities. There was no immediate official confirmation of the report.

As part of the reported deal, the two sides would also study the prospects of resuming flights between the two nations and facilitating the visa process for the citizens of both countries. Saudi Arabia and Iran are longtime regional rivals, but have moved toward reconciliation as part of a deal brokered by China last month.

If confirmed, the agreement would represent a new step toward reconciliation after seven years of tension. The rapprochement, which was initiated last month, lowers the chance of armed conflict between the Mideast rivals – both directly and in proxy conflicts around the region, reports AP.

The initial reconciliation agreement was brokered by Beijing in March.

It represents a major diplomatic victory for the Chinese as Gulf Arab states perceive the United States slowly withdrawing from the wider Middle East. It also comes as diplomats have been trying to end a long war

in Yemen, a conflict in which both Iran and Saudi Arabia are deeply entrenched.

On Thursday morning, Saudi Arabia's state-run Al-Ekhbariya TV showed Prince Faisal bin Farhan Al Saud and his Iranian counterpart, Hossein Amirabdollahian, shaking hands and sitting side by side. It was the first formal meeting of senior diplomats from the two nations since 2016, when the kingdom broke ties with Iran after protesters invaded Saudi diplomatic posts there. Saudi Arabia had executed a prominent Shiite cleric with 46 others days earlier, triggering the demonstrations

'Taliban women staff ban violates world body's charter', warns UN

Atop UN official warned Wednesday that a Taliban government order banning Afghan women from working for its mission in the country "is going to violate" the world body's charter, which rejects gender segregation.

The Taliban authorities have imposed a slew of restrictions on Afghan women since seizing power in 2021, including banning them from higher education and many government jobs.

The increasing curbs are reminiscent of the Taliban's first government between 1996 and 2001, when the UN said they were responsible for repeated human rights violations -- particularly against girls and women.

The UN said on Tuesday the Taliban government had extended a ban on women working for non-governmental organisations to the world body's workforce of 400 Afghan women, reports AFP.

The UN had thus far been exempt from a December order for all foreign and domestic aid agencies to stop women from working across the crisis-stricken nation.

UN humanitarian coordinator in Afghanistan Ramiz Alakbarov told AFP in an interview: "The charter of the United Nations is going to be violated."

"It is absolutely clear that no authority can give

instructions to the United Nations ... on who should be employed," he said. "We are not going to make an exception."

The UN airlifted \$1.8 billion into Afghanistan between December 2021 and January 2023, funding an aid lifeline for the nation's 38 million citizens and shoring up the domestic economy.

Alakbarov said the Taliban government order was a "huge violation" of women's rights. "Women are absolutely essential to all aspects of our service delivery work in Afghanistan," he said.


The UN's 400 female Afghan employees are the bulk of its 600 female staff working in Afghanistan. In total, there are about 3,300 Afghans in the 3,900-strong UN workforce there.

The Taliban government has imposed an austere interpretation of Islam since surging back to power.

Authorities have barred teenage girls from secondary school, women have been pushed out of many government jobs, prevented from travelling without a male relative and ordered to cover up outside the home, ideally with a burga.

Women have also been banned from universities and are not allowed to enter parks or gardens.

Punjab elections to be held on May 14 instead of Oct: Pak election commission

The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) on Wednesday announced May 14 as the revised date for the Punjab Assembly polls, Pakistan-based Dawn newspaper reported. This comes after the Pakistan Supreme Court's (SC) directives that the elections be

held on May 14 instead of the previously notified date of October 8.

The revised schedule was issued in a notification which cited the Supreme Court's order in response to a petition filed by the PTI against the ECP's decision to delay the Punjab Assembly elections from the originally decided date of April 30 to October 8.

According to Dawn, elections to the Punjab Assembly have been due since January this year when the house was dissolved. In early March, the ECP had proposed that the elections be held between April 30 and May 7 and subsequently, President Arif Alvi accepted the commission's recommendations by setting April 30 as the date for the polls, reports ANI.

The date was officially notified by the electoral watchdog on March 8, but it was later deferred to October 8 in another notification issued by the ECP on March 22, as per Dawn.

The commission in the latest notification issued today said it was recalling its March 22 notification and partially modifying the March 8 notification.

Under the revised schedule, the last date for the filing of appeals against the decisions of the returning officer rejecting or accepting the candidates' nomination papers has been set as April 10.

Japan to fund defence projects of friendly nations

Tapan on Wednesday said it plans to offer friendly nations financial assistance to help them bolster their defences, marking Tokyo's first unambiguous departure from rules that forbid using international aid for military purposes.

Japan's Overseas Security Assistance (OSA) will be operated separately from the Overseas Development Assistance (ODA) programme that for decades has funded roads, dams and other civilian infrastructure projects, Chief Cabinet Secretary Hirokazu Matsuno said at a regular news conference.

"By enhancing their security and deterrence capabilities, OSA aims to deepen our security cooperation with the countries, to create a desirable security environment for Japan," a statement released by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs on Wednesday said.

The aid will not be used to buy lethal weapons that recipient countries could use in conflicts with other nations in accordance with the three principles that govern arms exports, reports Reuters.

The Philippines and Bangladesh are likely to be included as the first recipients of the aid, a government source involved in talks said to Reuters.

Japan is considering providing radars to the Philippines to help it monitor Chinese activity in the contested South China Sea, and also weighing Fiji and Malaysia as potential recipients of the aid, the Yomiuri newspaper reported on Monday.

The decision to expand the scope of international aid to military-related projects follows Japan's announcement in December of a military build up that will double defence spending within five years as it looks to counter China's growing military might in Asia.

King Charles' wife gets 'Queen' title on coronation invite

King Charles III's wife has been officially identified as Queen Camilla for the first time, with Buckingham Palace using the title on invitations for the monarch's May 6 coronation.

Camilla, who until now has been described as queen consort, is given equal billing on the ornate medieval style invitations that will be sent to more than 2000 guests and were unveiled on Tuesday.

The new title is another step in the remarkable transformation of a woman once derided as a homewrecker because of her role in the breakdown of Charles' marriage to the late Princess Diana.

Charles and Camilla met long before the future king married Diana in 1981 and their relationship continued throughout the tumultuous marriage. That made Camilla an object of scorn among Diana's many



fans, who rallied around the princess as her marriage collapsed, reports AP.

But Camilla has won over much of the British public with her warmth and down-to-earth humour since she married Charles in a civil ceremony in 2005. The late Queen Elizabeth II early last year issued a statement saying she hoped Camilla would be known as "queen consort" when Charles became king.

Camilla will be crowned alongside her husband on May 6 at Westminster Abbey.

Donald Trump has a child out-of-wedlock?

In Donald Trump's indictment released by prosecutors following arraignment, a previously unknown victim of the former president and the National Enquirer's so-called "catch-and-kill" campaign was revealed. Donald Trump's lawyer Michael Cohen directed the head of American Media Inc to purchase the rights to a story being spread by a doorman at Trump Tower, prosecutors said.

The doorman claimed to have knowledge of an out-of-wedlock child supposedly fathered Donald Trump. Although, the story was not true, the company was told by Donald Trump's lawyer to hold on to rights for the story until after the November 2016 presidential election, the indictment revealed, reports Hindustan Times.

"[I]n or about October or November 2015, the AMI



CEO learned that a former Trump Tower doorman (the "Doorman") was trying to sell information regarding a

child that the Defendant had allegedly fathered out of wedlock," reads the indictment.

"AMI purchased the information from the Doorman without fully investigating his claims, but the AMI CEO directed that the deal take place because of his agreement with the Defendant and Lawyer A. 11. When AMI later concluded that the story was not true, the AMI CEO wanted to release the Doorman from the agreement. However, Lawyer A instructed the AMI CEO not to release the Doorman until after the presidential election, and the AMI CEO complied with that instruction because of his agreement with the Defendant and Lawyer A," it continued.

Trump's lawyer Michael Cohen is currently serving prison time over his involvement in the hush money scheme while Donald Trump was accused of falsifying business records in 34 separate instances.

Dans ces conditions, il est bien difficile d'établir avec précision si on est sur le point d'attendre ou si on a déjà dépassé le point d'inflexion dans le rapport de force politique.

Toutefois, le dernier épisode entre le chef de l'Église catholique à Maurice et le chef du gouvernement mérite qu'on s'y attarde. En l'absence d'études d'opinion fiables et incontestées, on ne peut donc pas vraiment donner de réponse précise et factuelle à cette question.

Mais les réseaux sociaux ainsi que la couverture médiatique donnent une indication claire des points chauds politiques du moment. Depuis le début de l'année, le cocktail malsain qui incorpore les réseaux de blanchiment d'argent issu du trafic de drogue, les conflits entre institutions et les cas de corruption allégués au gouvernement donne une gueule de bois durable à une partie de l'électorat. Why Finland is the happiest country in the world – an expert explains

Finns have good schools, public transport, and the difference between the highest- and lowest-paid is quite small.

These are factors in high levels of happiness

Finland has been the happiest country on earth for the past six years, according to the World Happiness Survey. This survey relies on the Cantril ladder life evaluation question:


'Please imagine a ladder with steps numbered from zero at the bottom to 10 at the top. The top of the ladder represents the best possible life for you and the bottom of the ladder represents the worst possible

life for you. On which step of the ladder would you say you personally feel you stand at this time?'

Finland comes out top, followed by Denmark and Iceland. Just why Finns are happier than others comes down to a number of factors including lower income inequality (most importantly, the difference between the highest paid and the lowest paid), high social support, freedom to make decisions, and low levels of corruption.

The graph below shows all 44 counties for which there is both happiness data and income inequality data, each as a coloured dot. The vertical scale shows average happiness, the horizontal scale income inequality.

The measure of income inequality used here is the Gini coefficient of income inequality, as reported by the OECD. It is the highest rate recorded in each county in any year after 2010 up to the most recent year for which there is data. The graph shows the close relationship



between these two measures. In general, when income inequality is larger, money matters more and people are less happy

Finland also has other attributes that may help people feel happier. It has a highly decentralised publicly funded healthcare system and only a very small private health sector. This is far more effective and efficient than some alternatives used in other countries. Public transport is reliable and affordable, and Helsinki airport is ranked as the best in northern Europe.

There is a Finnish proverb that seems relevant here: Onnellisuus on se paikka puuttuvaisuuden ja yltäkylläisyyden välillä (Happiness is a place between too little and too much).

How Finland compares

Finland, Norway and Hungary report similar levels of income inequality, yet people in Finland are, on average, happier. Why is this?

According to the World Inequality Database, the highest-paid tenth of people in Finland take home a third of all income (33%). That contrasts with the same group taking 36% in the UK and 46% in the US. These differences may not appear great, but they have a huge effect on overall happiness because so much less is left for the rest in the more unequal countries – and the rich become more fearful. When a small number of people become much richer, this is an understandable fear.

In 2021, it was suggested by a sociology professor that simply by having more reasonable expectations, people in Nordic countries appeared to be happier. However, that cannot explain why Finland is so very different from Norway on the happiness scale.

All kinds of explanations are possible, including slight nuances of language as well as culture. There is now even the question of whether this global survey is beginning to introduce its own bias, as Finns now know why they are being asked the question (they moved even further ahead of Denmarkin the most recent survey).

However, it is very likely that Finland having more equitable schools, where you are likely to get a good education whichever you choose, as well as a fairer school policy than Norway (almost all Finns go to their nearest school) might actually matter too. So too, a better housing policy with a wide variety of social housing and lower homelessness, a health service with waiting times that are the envy of the world – sometimes just

being a matter of days (even during the worst years of the pandemic) – and numerous other accolades.

Finland ranks first, second or third in over 100 global measures of economic and social success – better than Norway does. And it has less money overall (and hardly any oil). You could excuse the Finns a little smugness (*omahyväisyys*).

Why does Hungary do so badly despite the income gap between its people being hardly any wider than in Finland and Norway? One could argue that this is to do with its divided politics. In 2022, the European parliament suggested that "Hungary can no longer be considered a full democracy".

In contrast, South Africa and China may be a little happier than their levels of inequality would suggest. South Africa became a democracy in 1994 shortly after Nelson Mandela was freed, and many people will remember the previous period. People in China are not as fearful as they are often portrayed in the west.

Inequality is a factor

Most countries exhibit happiness levels (and much else) that are very predictable from their inequality levels. The UK is spot on in the middle of what you would expect for one of Europe's most economically unequal countries.

The graph above also shows that (almost as unequal) Israel is a little happier than it ought to be – although it is not clear that the sample taken there included all groups that currently live under that state. Also, that sample was taken in 2022, before the recent widespread protests in Israel

The other outlier shown in the graph is Costa Rica, where the president said in 2019:

'Seventy years ago, Costa Rica did away with the army. This allows for many things. Eight per cent of our GDP is invested in education because we don't have to spend on the army. So our strength is human talent, human wellbeing.'

So what can the people of a country do if they want to be happier? The most important thing is to elect governments that will ensure the country becomes more equal by income. After that, ensuring your social services – school, housing and healthcare – are efficient and equitable matters most. And finally, consider your degree of freedom, whether you are actually including everyone in your surveys, and how fearful your population is.

The Tentacles of Finance

inancial power has many visible and invisible strings. It is patent of the system, and is reminiscent of the Tsaritsa Alix and Rasputin dancing to the tune of the German Kaiser or of Hitler's Quislings. It is awe, patronage, stare, soft-patting, expectation of benevolence and such other matters by which those who have come to exert influence

and pressure on the have-nots. The influence grips the heart and the mind and come to cast a spell on their thought and feeling and ultimately to play with the life and living of the multitude.

Employment sustains life but the employment of the bulk of the people lies at the entire mercy of the financial combine. Although salaries and wages swallow up three-fourth of the revenues, less than 20,000 are employed by the State. Unemployment is represented by one and a half times this number. The rest of the population must seek work with private enterprises or go without food. More than 10% of the people are unemployed, about 10% are either under-employed or under irregular, fitful and sporadic employment or have just an apology of employment.

Those who are supposed to be fully employed cannot, even with the best of effort and goodwill, make enough to provide the five essentials to their family. Those who have enough have no security of tenure or any guaranteed prop for their old age. For every available job there are dozens longing to manoeuvre or scramble.

The spectre of hunger looms large in what appears to be a prosperous country.

It is in the interest of capitalism to perpetuate this position, to undo all assertive strength from the masses. Any demonstration or attempt at the expression of speech, action, association or manifestation is sternly frowned at, and it is obvious that this system leads to the thriving of a legion of spies, eavesdroppers, informers, toadies and flunkies on the vices of favouritism, racialism, nepotism, etc. Armed with this stout and unassailable position, insult, dismissals for paltry reasons, evictions, immorality, trespass and all similar sadistic practices are callously perpetuated every day. Both the laws and the authorities look at all this in confounded helplessness.

This is the effect of the system on the life of the average Mauritian. There are five agencies by which the progress of country is ensured: the Parties, the Trade Unions, the Cooperative Movement, the Press and the religious organisations. It will be interesting to study the stranglehold of finance on some of these agencies. This is in addition to the grip on the administration of this country. The sum total of the effect is that this country is being twisted, bundled, cautiously wrapped, gaudily labelled and handled to the financial magnates as a friendly gift. This just at a time when drums are beating and trumpets are dinning in the proud proclaim of the establishment of Responsible Government in Mauritius. The art of make-believe has been developed to such finesse and casuistry that even some people pretending to be leaders are taken in without in the least suspecting that they are thus driving the nail in the coffin of the people of their country, the every



people who have sacrificed so much to boost them up to their dizzy heights.

We have pointedly asked the opposite Party to prove that it does not draw large sums from secret funds of the Tories to fight the workers of the country, and it has never had courage to deny it. In fact, it is known that fantastic amounts are spent to fight the Labour candidates. Whoever wishes to fight Labour is apt to become a beneficiary. Mos t office-bearers in the Party draw far too much money than their intrinsic worth appears to warrant. Although any intelligent person can see the utter stupidity of people who thus open out their purse and although most of the money is squandered without any effective good for the cause they want to serve, the fact remains that the tentacles are spread with the sole idea of creating confusion in politics. It is also known that on private concerns this Party enjoys special favours and privileges, and that for no earthly reason partisans and sympathisers of the Labour Party are harassed to an inhuman degree. Thousand and one forms of direct and indirect pressure are brought to bear on people to change their political opinion, and if pressure and persuasion do not create any effect other more drastic measures are resorted to without any compunction.

In some quarters, money is placed first and then the community. The idea of morality, justice, fairness or even religion play a very insignificant part. The rapacity to grab everything without scruple and the desire of building up the welfare of the community overrides all national considerations. It is an incorrigible outlook and nothing has been able to bring the least change. They would rather spend more to victimise the man than to give him his due. They would rather sink thousands on lawyers and courts than pay a few hundred on his legitimate rights. Mixed with the economic issues is the camouflaged perpetuation of the colour bar and the silly idea of the superiority of the White race, and this more than anything else hampers the growth of a Mauritian harmony.

Just like that parties, some trade unions are said to derive funds from secret sources, and membership fees are even said to be paid to boost up puppet Unions to dodge the law and to keep the genuine Unions at bay. It becomes too apparent when it is realised that these puppet Unions are often made to sign dictated terms, which, in

the final analysis, appear to undercut the rights of the workers by reducing them by millions.

In smaller countries, cooperation is the basic economic movement that can buttress the life of the average man. By either thrift, savings, cooperative production, marketing and stores or small industries, the man has been able to supplement his wages and to be able to cope with contingencies with the result that it is not necessary to live from hand to mouth in perpetual wretchedness. If cooperation has not made any progress in these or more progress in providing credit facilities, it is just because it has to hurt against the solid financial phalanx of the combines. Money-lending itself has become a flourishing business and it has many aspects from forced mortgage and seizure to usuries running into forms that are neither moral nor human. it is not possible in this unholy atmosphere for cooperation to make any headway.

The underpaid worker must, of necessity, find something more to make up his family budget, He wants fodder to rear animals, land to grow odd crops; capital to set up something, a plot of land to build a football ground or to improve social services or his amenities; facilities to provide himself with some fish or shrimps or leafy vegetables: work for extra revenues; security and pensions. Everywhere he has to hurt against the stout phalanx of finance and he cannot, with the best of wills and courage, extricate himself from the many entanglements spread round him. The distilleries produce rum from molasses, and shops go on serving clandestinely after closing hours and tempt him to get drunk and he comes to take to an unregulated life, and crimes and morality begin to rear their ugly heads. Family life is wrecked, and children dreading the flux and influx of in-laws either become famished and anemic or take to a life that take them from Probation to Borstal to long terms of imprisonment. The gallows or the grave yawn before them before they have tasted the sweets of life.

Frustrated in his economic salvation, the man wishes sometimes to take cover under the protection of law to find that the Police and Judicial Departments even today retain a high percentage of the same class in their services, and he is no little alarmed to see that this class has more than a strangling grip upon the social services of the country. He may wish to seek the protection of religion. In a country which has one wealthy section, and the others looking up to it, it also invariably takes the position of commanding religion and morality. The rich have special privileges, special pews, special services for special prices and very often the clergy hang to them for some odd favours or patronage. In this way, in capitalist countries the church (and also the mosque and temple) becomes an obsequious servant of the masters who invariably call for the tune.

I consider that more heinous than the grip of finance on economic political, social and moral affairs is the strangle-hold on the intellect. It does engender a passivity in the brain, a spirit of complaisant subjectivity of treatment, and the mind goes to sleep in a kind of Elysium of the academic cloud. It is a negation of life. People seem to shirk discussing living subjects that affect our country and the welfare of the inhabitants in order not to be embroiled into controversies, and ultimately not to be in the bad books of the masters. The passive, airy attitude of most of our front-rank journalists is shockingly discomforting when we visualise the future of our country.

Such is indeed the grip that the tentacles of finance has spread on all sides of Mauritian life into a stranglehold from which progress seems to have become much cry and little wool.

Beneath the Trump circus, American democracy faces up to a vital challenge

His son, Donald Trump Junior, posted a picture of the daughter of Judge Juan Merchan. This week, in the shadow of yet another school shooting in Nashville, Fox News host Tucker Carlson warned viewers that the indictment meant it was "probably not the best time to give up your AR-15".

take the same measures to win power; that there are "two sides" or that "both sides" are as dangerous as each other. This is also sometimes described as the "horseshoe theory" of politics.

In the modern United States, the evidence does not support this framing. One side is facing over 30 felony



Posts and statements like these can only be read for what they are: clear attempts to foment further racist violence against anyone cast as an enemy.

Such calls fit into a pattern of incitement that has led to violence in the past and will likely do so again. Trump and his supporters have given no indication that they are concerned about inciting unrest; they are actively and knowingly encouraging it.

It is more than likely that they will continue to do so, using events like the arraignment today to double down on conspiracy theories. And they will have plenty of chances: the trial in New York could drag on, potentially, for over a year, and indictments in other state and federal investigations now seem more likely.

As I have written before, political violence is a feature, not a bug, of American politics. That's partly why widely held perceptions of impending Civil War are so concerning; not necessarily because Civil War is likely, but because growing certainty that it is coming can give further license to violence now perceived as inevitable anyway.

Much of the coverage and analysis of American politics will describe the nation as "divided" or "polarised". But polarisation isn't really an accurate way to characterise the state of US politics today. Polarisation implies a kind of equality - that sides are divided into equal but opposite extremes, willing to

charges, in what is likely only the start of an impending wave of indictments across state and federal investigations. Those investigations, collectively, paint a damning picture of a conspiracy to subvert the world's most important democracy. In the United States, the "other side" - which is far from immune from critique - is at least attempting to get on with the business of democratically elected government.

The focus instead has of course been on the Trump media circus, now very familiar to us all. The black, armoured SUVs crawling across New York City streets; "plane watch"; the tshirts; the farcical, gold-tinted press conferences. The mainstream press may well be falling, once again, into the traps Trump has laid so carefully.

But it's also much more than that, this time around. How this all plays out will be yet another litmus test for the strength of American democracy. And it's an essential one: simply put, the United States can not, must not, fail this test. The consequences of failure aren't just domestic. Viewed from afar, we might be tempted to dismiss this as just more hijinks in the compelling but distant drama of American politics. But the outcome will affect us all. So we will we must - keep watching.

hile culture and identity wars have become the stage for a raging feud between opponents in the USA, they are not far below the surface elsewhere and, in particular, in the UK and South Asia. In the UK, the traditional wariness of foreigners has in the past twenty years given way to a more naked discourse about immigrants flocking into Britain, an indictment of multiple policies felt as failures (boat people across the Channel, the refugee crisis from the Middle East or the Balkans, asylum seeker processes, the Windrush scandal, etc) with fatal consequences for the UK's membership of the EU. No civilised discourse seems possible these days without reference to the immigration question in one form or another and the Home Minister, Suella Braverman is only pandering to a scare-mongering narrative that cuts across political parties and has dominated British politics now for more than 20 years.

In the far more volatile South Asia environment, culture and identity differences have another layer of complexity due to religious and faith divergences. West Pakistan's political and military establishment, for instance, believed that the country could not be ruled by a Bengali leader, despite being of Muslim faith. This led to the po-grom in East Pakistan and the birth of a cultural entity Bangladesh in the historic libe-ration war of 1971. Since then, Pakistan has been left uncertain as to what is the glue that holds the country together if it is not religion: a collection of tribes or ethnicities without even a common language or simply the India-hate policy that its successive military juntas have

adhered to. This too may be slowly frittering away as regional cultures (Sindhis, Balochs, Pashtuns, etc) resent the Punjabi domination and the part of Kashmir under Pakistan occupation, ask themselves if their brothers and sisters on the Indian side are not far bet-

Neither are questions of identity and culture any easier in the variety and diversity of India despite being a democratic subcontinent advancing on the economic and political world stage. Powerful forces from overseas (e.g., billionaire George Soros) are suspected to be funding a variety of internal agents to disrupt India's growth, affluence and general stability. Both Rahul Gandhi and the Indian National Congress, which has a long-mixed bag history, may be seen as part of that anti-national patchwork or playing up to such forces.

Nationalism, culture and pride in the newfound identity of India Inc might therefore dominate the next general elections, as they did in 2019.

Sitting all day is terrible for your health

A new study finds a relatively easy way to counteract it

o reduce the harmful health effects of sitting, take a five-minute light walk every half-hour. That's the key finding of a new study that my colleagues and I published in the journal Medicine & Science in Sports & Exercise.

We asked 11 healthy middle-aged and older adults to sit in our lab for eight hours – representing a standard workday – over the course of five separate days. On one of those days, participants sat for the entire eight hours with only short breaks to use the bathroom. On the other days, we tested a number of different strategies to break up a person's sitting with light walking. For example, on one day, participants walked for one minute every half-hour. On another day, they walked for five minutes every hour.

Our goal was to find the least amount of walking one could do to offset the harmful health effects of sitting. In particular, we measured changes in blood sugar levels and blood pressure, two important risk factors for heart disease.

We found that a five-minute light walk every half-hour was the only strategy that reduced blood sugar levels substantially compared with sitting all day. In particular, five-minute walks every half-hour reduced the blood sugar spike after eating by almost 60%.

That strategy also reduced blood pressure by four to five points compared with sitting all day. But shorter and less frequent walks improved blood pressure too. Even just a one-minute light walk every hour reduced blood pressure by five points.

In addition to physical health benefits, there were also mental health benefits to the walking breaks. During the study, we asked participants to rate their mental state by using a questionnaire. We found that compared with sitting all day, a five-minute light walk every half-hour reduced feelings of fatigue, put participants in a better mood and helped them feel more energized. We also found that even walks just once every hour were enough to boost mood and reduce feelings of fatigue.

Why it matters

People who sit for hours on end develop chronic diseases including diabetes, heart disease, dementia and several types of cancer at much higher rates than people who move throughout their day. A sedentary lifestyle also puts people at a much greater risk of early death. But just exercising daily may not reverse the harmful health effects of sitting.

Because of technological advances, the amount of time adults in industrialized countries like the U.S. spend sitting has been steadily increasing for decades. Many adults now spend the majority of their day sitting. This problem has only gotten worse since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic. With the migration to more remote work, people are less inclined to venture out of the house these days. So it's clear that strategies are needed to combat a growing 21st century public health problem.

Current guidelines recommend that adults should "sit

less, move more." But these recommendations don't provide any specific advice or strategies for how often and how long to move.


Our work provides a simple and affordable strategy: Take a five-minute light walk every half-hour. If you have a job or lifestyle where you have to sit for prolonged periods, this one behaviour change could reduce your health risks from sitting

Our study also offers clear guidance to employers on how to promote a healthier workplace. While it may seem counterintuitive, taking regular walking breaks can actually help workers be more productive than working without stopping.

What still isn't known

Our study primarily focused on taking regular walking breaks at a light intensity. Some of the walking strategies – for example, one-minute light walks every hour – did not lower blood sugar levels. We don't know if more rigorous walking would have provided health benefits at these doses.

Many adults have jobs, such as driving trucks or taxis, where they simply cannot walk every half-hour. Finding alternative strategies that yield comparable results can provide the public with several different options and ultimately allow people to pick the strategy that works best for them and their lifestyle.

We love coffee, tea, chocolate and soft drinks so much, caffeine is literally in our blood

cientists at Oregon State University may have proven how much people love coffee, tea, chocolate, soda and energy drinks as they validated their new method for studying how different drugs interact in the body.

In conducting mass spectrometry research, Richard van Breemen and Luying Chen worked with various biomedical suppliers to purchase 18 batches of supposedly pure human blood serum pooled from multiple donors. Biomedical suppliers get their blood from blood banks, who pass along inventory that's nearing its expiration

All 18 batches tested positive for caffeine. Also, in many of the samples the researchers found traces of cough medicine and an anti-anxiety drug. The findings point to the potential for contaminated blood transfusions, and also suggest that blood used in research isn't neces-

"From a 'contamination' standpoint, caffeine is not a big worry for patients, though it may be a commentary on current society," said Chen, a PhD student. "But the other drugs being in there could be an issue for patients, as well as posing a problem for those of us doing this type of research because it's hard to get clean blood samples."

The study was published in the Journal of Pharmaceutical and Biomedical Analysis.

In addition to caffeine, the research also involved testing pooled serum for alprazolam, an anti-anxiety medicine sold under the trade name Xanax; dextromethorphan, an over-the-counter cough suppressant; and tolbutamide, a medicine used to treat type 2

All of the pooled serum was free of tolbutamide, but eight samples contained dextromethorphan and 13 contained alprazolam -- possibly meaning that if you ever need a blood transfusion, your odds of also receiving caffeine, cough medicine and an anti-anxiety drug are

Personality traits affect retirement spending

▼ow quickly you spend your savings in Hretirement may have as much or more to do with your personality than whether you have a lot of debt or want to leave an inheritance.

A new study published by the American Psychological Association found that people who are more agreeable or more open to new experiences -or those who are more neurotic or negative -- might spend their retirement savings at a faster rate than those who are more extroverted or have a positive attitude.

Sarah Asebedo, PhD, of Texas Tech University and her coauthor, Christopher

Browning, PhD, analyzed personality and psychological data from more than 3,600 people in the United States age 50 or older (the average age was 70) in the 2012 and 2014 waves of the Health and Retirement Study. The data were paired with tax data from the same participants to account for withdrawals from individual retirement accounts. The researchers only used participants who made withdrawals from their retirement accounts and other saving accounts.

Participants were scored on what psychologists call the big five personality traits: Openness to experience (i.e., they are creative, imaginative, adventurous and curious), conscientiousness (i.e., they are organized, thorough, hardworking and cautious), extroversion, agreeableness (i.e., they are sympathetic, caring, warm and helpful) and neuroticism (i.e., they are nervous, worrying, moody and not calm). The researchers also looked at data about



the amount of control participants perceived they had over their financial situation and to what extent they felt a variety of positive and negative emotions over the previous 30 days.

The findings suggest that financial professionals should take the personality traits of their clients into account when developing retirement strategies instead of focusing entirely on their clients' financial situations, according to Asebedo.

A higher withdrawal rate is not necessarily a bad thing nor is a lower withdrawal rate always good, she warned.

"A higher portfolio withdrawal rate is concerning if it places the individual on a path to run out of money too early. However, if the higher portfolio withdrawal rate does not run the risk of running out of money, then it may very well be facilitating a life well-lived," Asebedo said. "Similarly, a lower withdrawal rate is a good thing if it facilitates controlled spending from the portfolio at a level that protects it from early depletion. If the individual is underspending and forgoing experiences that they would enjoy because of a saving habit they are unable to break, then the low withdrawal rate is a missed opportunity to maximize the life that they have saved for.'

Curious What happens if you don't get enough sleep?

Some animals have belly buttons that are easy to see, but others have ones that are more difficult to spot.

his is a really good question Hedya, because it makes us think about how important sleep is. Actually, sleep is one of the most important things we do.

While you were sleeping ...

When we sleep our bodies are really doing quite a lot of work. In the first few hours, we go into a very deep sleep. That's when our body is resting and repairing. It's when we fill up our energy stores for the next day.


At different times of the night, we also have a lot of lighter sleep. This includes something called "rapid eye movement" sleep or REM sleep. That's when someone's eyes flicker and move, even when shut.

During this type of sleep, we dream. Our brain is very, very active. It's busy sorting and organising information, storing memories and even working out problems.

So there's a lot of really important things that go on when we sleep

So what happens if we don't sleep?

The first most obvious thing that happens when we don't sleep is we get sleepy. When we don't get enough rest, it's also harder to be active, want to do things, or get excited about things.



No wonder a lack of sleep can make us grumpy and irritable.

If we don't get enough REM sleep, it makes it harder to concentrate and learn. It makes it harder to remember school work from one day to the next. All these things make it harder to do well in school.

So having the right amount of sleep is really impor-

How about if I have a few bad nights?

If we don't get good sleep on one night or two, we can probably catch up. Our bodies and brains will recover and we will be fine.

But if we don't have enough sleep or not good quality sleep for a long time, that's different. As sleep controls so many aspects of our health, this can really mess with our bodies and brains.

We are more likely to fail a year at school, put on weight, become depressed and get pretty sick for a long time, just to name a few examples.

So it's really best to set up good sleep patterns early in life so that doesn't happen to us.

How much is enough sleep?

Not everybody needs exactly the same amount of sleep. But people who study sleep, like me, think someone in your age group, Hedya, usually needs between nine and 11 hours a night.

We also need good quality sleep. This means it needs to be restful, without too much waking up at night. It also means we need to make sure we go to bed and wake up around the same times every day.





Worst days

Do things like these ever happen to you?

You put your keys in a perfect spot. "They're right here on the table," you think. "Right here on the table." Later, you spend 25 minutes looking for your keys.

You need three things at the store: bread, milk, butter. No need to write this down. You get to the store, grab the milk, and you can't for the life of you remember the other two items.

It happens to all of us.

I've had the chance over the past few years to explore quite a few things that people can do to improve and sustain their memory, often based on research in neuroscience. Because, if there's one thing successful business leaders seem to share as they get older, it's that fear of losing their memory and other cognitive abilities is at the top of the list.

Before we forget some of the best of these, let's revisit them in one place.

1. Eat specific foods

This is a good one to start with. Specifics:

Mushrooms. Writing in the 'Journal of Neurochemistry', Australian scientists reported recently that a specific type of mushrooms contain an active compound that "boosts nerve growth and enhances memory." Separately, Pennsylvania State University researchers found that other types of mushrooms – porcini may be the best – contain antioxidants that fight medical conditions associated with aging, like cancer, coronary heart disease and Alzheimer's disease.

Dark chocolate and cinnamon. Just



to keep going, a few other tasty foods: dark chocolate (an Italian study suggests as much as three months' cognitive benefit) and cinnamon (a review in Nutritional Neuroscience of more than 2,600 studies found that cinnamon significantly improves cognitive function.

Vegetables of all kinds. A Harvard study followed the eating habits of 27,842 men over 20 years. Their conclusions? The ones who ate the most vegetables and fruit – even fruit juice – had less memory loss late in life.

2. Build good relationships

We've seen many times that the key to a happy and fulfilled life is very likely to focus first on your relationships. And there are so many simple, practical ways to improve relationship quality.

Perhaps most surprising: Make a habit of auditing your relationships. Write them down and categorize the ones that provide value and the ones you'd like to improve. It's a lot easier to improve things

if you measure them.

Now, there's research suggesting memory is also impacted by relationships, and that (according to a Baylor College of Medicine study reported in the journal, 'Neuron'), during periods of social isolation, the most prevalent cells in our brains, known as astrocytes, "become hyperactive, which in turn suppresses brain circuit function and memory formation."

3. Improve your environment

Another easy one: Michigan State University researchers studying Nile grass rats say they found that rats kept in dimly lit environments lost nearly a third of capacity in the part of their brains devoted to learning and memory, compared to those in brighter environments.

As the study authors put it: "[D]im lights are producing dimwits."

We can associate this one with the above: A study at the Chronobiology and Sleep Institute at the University of

Pennsylvania found that even a small sleep deficit leads to correlative "deficits ... in vigilance and episodic memory."

At a certain level of sleep deficit, the brain loses the ability to sense just how tired you actually are.

4. Spend your time wisely

A variety of cognitive-based activities seems to help, among them:

Detailed hobbies, like bird-watching, that require you to process and recall information.

Reading for pleasure. Researchers from the Beckman Institute for Advanced Science and Technology at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign found that reading for pleasure, 90 minutes at a time, "strengthened older adults' memory skills."

Doing brain games and crosswords. Researchers from Columbia and Duke universities found that study participants who did crosswords improved "cognition, function and neuroprotection."

5. Walk backwards

Researchers at the University of Roehampton in London came up with the idea of testing whether simply walking backward could trigger better recall.

Sure enough, it worked. "Motion-induced past-directed mental time travel improved mnemonic performance for different types of information," said one of the study leads. "We have named this a 'mnemonic time-travel effect."

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Limit screen time to help young people feel better about how they look

New research found teens and young adults who even briefly cut time on social media gained self esteem. Try these 5 tips from Allison Aubrey of NPR to help them...

A new study, published Thursday by the American Psychological Association, validates what some parents have experienced when their teenagers cut back: They seem to feel better about themselves. I've seen this in my own kids when they return from summer camp, where phones are not allowed. They seem more at ease and less moody.

Social media can feel like a comparison trap, says study author Helen Thai, a doctoral student in psychology at McGill University. Her research found that limiting screen time to about one hour a day helped anxious teens and young adults feel better about their body image and their appearance.

Here are some ideas to try:

1. Curate your social media feed to limit content that makes you feel bad

Instagram and TikTok are filled with idealized images of bodies. Filters can help people appear slimmer, more tan or wrinkle-free. "The algorithm is pushing body-centric content to you because that's what sells," says Lexie Kite, co-author with her twin sister of 'More Than a Body: Your Body is an Instrument, Not an Ornament'. She says social media platforms can amplify harmful cultural messages —



So, it's up to the user to push back. "Be incredibly mindful, as you scroll, of how each creator, each image, each account makes you feel," Kite says. If a post or story makes you feel uncomfortable or less-than, make a choice to mute or unfollow. "That's what I do," Kite says. "You are the only one who can curate your feed."

2. Schedule a one-day break from devices each week

Artist and film-maker Tiffany Shlain says there's a power to unplugging one day a week. She turns off her devices every Friday evening, and takes a 24-hour break, that she now refers to as "Tech Shabbat." She and her family started this tradition 13 years ago when her children were young

"There's something about that full day off each week that really resets me and each member of my family in a deep way," she says. And the irony of disconnecting from social media: "It's the day I feel most connected to my

family."

3. Turn off notifications and set limits on use of social media apps

If your intention is to limit social media to an hour a day, start by tracking your time on each app. The iPhone has a screen time tracker that lets you know how much time you spend on apps and websites, as well as how often you pick up your device.

"Smartphones allow you to set limits for individual apps to help with managing use," Thai says.

Also, you can turn off your social media notifications so they don't show up on your home screen. And set a daily downtime in your device settings. Thai says it comes down to goal setting, and then tracking your behaviour to help keep yourself accountable.

4. Use the time you were giving to social media to invest in real-life activities instead

This may sound obvious, but seeing your friends on social media is not the same as spending time with them. So, make some plans to connect with friends in real life. The same goes for self-care. Thai says she's been taking a break from social media. "I noticed less screen time meant more time for me to fit in other aspects of my life that I wanted to keep more consistent, like physical activity, reading, [and] listening to podcasts," says Thai.

5. Connect with people who share your interests and values

The world is filled with interesting people doing remarkable things. Social media can be a more positive place for teens or adults when you connect with people who share your interests and post inspiring ideas or stories. Kite says she unfollows people who make her feel uncomfortable, "and I replace them with activists."



La réalité d'ici et d'ailleurs

e soleil tapait fort ce jour-là à Port-Louis. A peine descendus de l'autobus, la santé et le confort obligent, les uns et les autres ont sorti parasol, chapeau de paille et casquette pour éviter de se faire cuire au soleil. Les touristes avertis étaient

équipés eux-aussi, heureux d'échapper à un hiver qui les faisait cailler en Europe; mais pas question de se farcir ou de griller au soleil, avec le risque de gâcher les vacances (le langage courant prête au soleil des vertus culinaires). Le soleil abîme nos tendres yeux par son éblouissement en plein été et serait responsable d'une espérance de vie moins longue à la différence de ceux que l'hiver enveloppe de son manteau gris pendant quelques mois dans lespays du Nord.

Un couple mauricien en bermudas, avec une casquette sur la tête, avançait avec leurs deux fils d'un pas nonchalant, de cet air décontracté des expatriés en vacances. Le cadet ayant cinq ou six ans tenait la main de sa mère, et contre toute attente, levales yeux vers ses parents et déclara: 'Je suis Mauricien.' L'aîné de dix ou onze ans scruta les abords de la ville sous le soleil accablant et lâcha son verdict: 'Moi, je suis Français.' Amusés par ce sursaut identitaire de leurs garçons, les parents sourièrent.

Quelques mètres plus loin, quelques touristes français pressaient le pas, très motivés à découvrir la capitale. L'un deux éclaira les lanternes du groupe: 'Hé! Vous savez qu'ils parlent plusieurs langues ici. Le créole, le français, l'anglais...". D'ordinaire, l'esprit français moyen ne s'aventure pas à prononcer le nom d'autres langues en dehors de ce trio linquistique.

Dans cet élan admiratif, le visiteur de passage ignore l'effet compresseur qu'a joué le kreol sur les deux autres langues grâce à la propagande des idéologues bien-intentionnés. L'appauvrissement du débat public et l'indigence de la pensée circonscrite par une lexique déficitaire en sont les conséquences. Jusqu'à présent, personne ne s'est donné la peine de mesurer l'étendue des dégâts dans les esprits et dans l'espace public.

tance, elle avoua qu'elle aimerait partir en France ou à la Réunion.

 C'est pour donner une meilleure vie à mes trois enfants, voyez-vous.

Son mari avait 60 ans et il venait de sortir de prison après cinq mois d'incarcération pour recel.

 Mais il ne savait pas que c'était des articles volés, assura-t-elle.

Elle n'avait pas reçu d'éducation formelle, mais elle était pleine d'énergie et de motivation. Quelles opportunités à Maurice? L'usine?

-Non, ce n'est pas intéressant pour moi, de longues heures de travail, je ne pourrai pas être là pour mes enfants à la sortie de l'école, et le salaire est insuffisant.

Pour toute mère qui se respecte, une disponibilité auprès des enfants est primordiale. En fait, il faudrait un minimum de Rs20,000 pour vivre à cinq, dit-elle.

-J'aimerais profiter de la vie, avoir une voiture et faire des sorties avec mes enfants, vous comprenez.

Quitte à faire le ménage à l'étranger, elle serait prête à s'envoler avec son époux et ses enfants vers d'autres cieux. Puis vint la requête inévitable.

-- Qu'en pensez-vous? Pourriez-vous faire quelque chose pour moi?

Le brin de causette reprit à chaque passage au marché. Elle leur laissait son nom: Mélanie Jane.

Cette charmante personne donnait envie qu'on lui tende la main. L'époque de sacrifices et de longues années d'attente pour sortir la tête de l'eau est révolue. Cela se comprend. Vivre pleinement, c'est maintenant. Pour l'heure, elle s'était résolue à vendre le terrain que son époux possédait à Baie duTombeau pour acheter une voiture et transporter ses plantes dans le nord de l'île où elle serait plus à même de trouver une meilleure clientèle.

Est-ce qu'elle voudrait émigrer légalement?

-- Ah oui, bien sûr. Je veux partir avec

des papiers en règle.

En effet, les années 70-80 sont loin derrière nous. Ce sont les années de l'interminable tunnel noir à traverser dans le silence de l'angoisse et du désespoir, où tous les subterfuges étaient bons pour se faire une place au soleil dans les pays froids.

Après une laborieuse mise en place de l'infrastructure industrielle et l'accès à l'éducation gratuite, le début des années 80 marquèrent un tournant dans un décollage économique qui ont veillé, depuis, à ce que la nourriture ne manque pas dans les ménages les plus modestes. Depuis les années 2000, la voiture est devenue le symbole incontournable de liberté et de loisirs. Quoi de plus normal que de vivre avec son temps!

C'est réconfortant, néanmoins, de constater que les plus démunis à Maurice sont bien loin du désespoir qui pousse des clandestins à s'aventurer sur des embarcations fragiles contre vents et marées pour atteindre les rives de l'Angleterre, assiégée par un flot de demandeurs d'asile. Ici, c'est sur les ailes volantes et avec des documents officiels en poche que la présente génération entend s'expatrier si besoin est.

Le tandem Sunak et Bravewoman

Si l'Angleterre a choisi le Brexit, c'est aussi pour retrouver sa souveraineté en matière d'accueil des migrants sans avoir à se plier aux diktats de l'Union européenne, elle-même soumise à d'autres lobbys du système capitaliste pour recruter une main-d'œuvre étrangère coûte que coûte, grossir le nombre de consommateurs, et, faisant d'une pierre deux coups, satisfaire au passage le projet des idéologues de l'Open Society d'encourager, non pas une immigration raisonnée, mais un envahissement de l'espace européen par le surplus d'une démographie galopante des pays du Sud.
